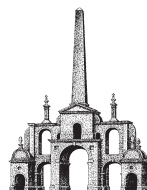


ABOUT THE IRISH GEORGIAN SOCIETY

ABOUT DUBLIN CITY HERITAGE AND CONSERVATION OFFICES

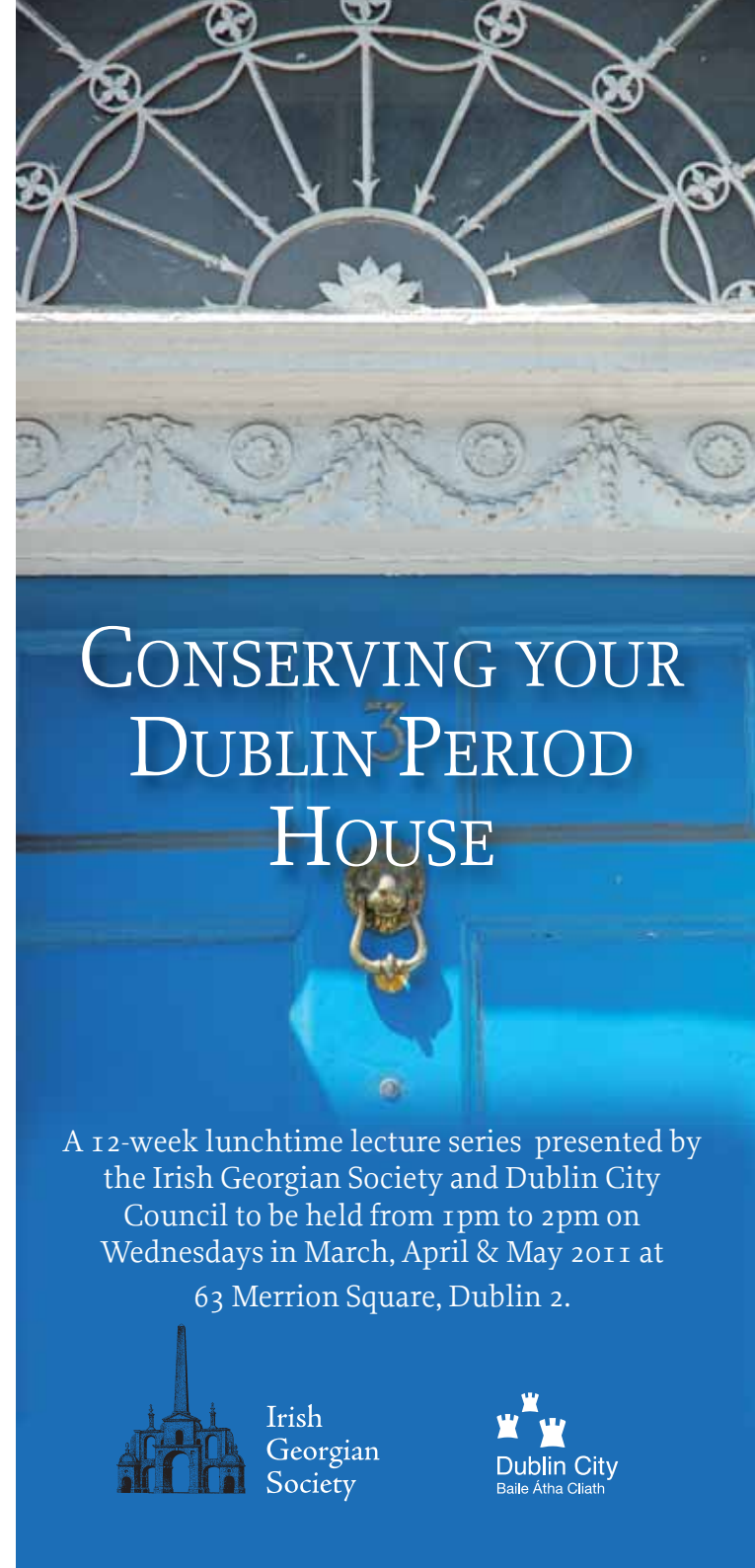

The Irish Georgian Society and Dublin City Council have assembled a team of leading conservation experts to deliver a lecture series on the understanding and care of Dublin's period houses. A certificate of attendance will be issued to those who attend all the lectures.

Aimed at those with an interest in Dublin's historic houses, the lectures will be relevant to owners and guardians of all periods and types of houses, from the modest Edwardian artisan dwellings to the substantial red bricks of the Victorian suburbs and the fine townhouses of our Georgian city squares. The lecture series will provide an appreciation of the significance of every aspect of Dublin's historic houses and practical information on their care, conservation and maintenance.

Lectures, which will start on Wednesday 2nd March 2011 (1pm - 2pm) and continue for 12 weeks, will take place in the Helen Roe Theatre, RSAI, 63 Merrion Square, Dublin 2.

It is possible to attend all, one or as many of the lectures as you wish. The lectures are priced at €10 (€5 fulltime students with card), which you may pay at the door or book in advance for a special price of 100 (€50 fulltime students with card) for all 12 lectures.
