## CONSERVING YOUR DUBLIN PERIOD HOUSE

Twelve lunchtime talks on the care and repair of your period house. Presented by the Irish Georgian Society and Dublin City Council on Tuesdays in February, March and April 2013 at 63 Merrion Square

The Irish Georgian Society and Dublin City Council have assembled a team of conservation experts to present a series of talks on the history and significance of Dublin's period houses and practical information on their care and conservation. Attendance at the talks will greatly benefit owners of all periods and types of houses, from the modest Edwardian artisan dwelling to the substantial red bricks of the Victorian suburbs and the fine townhouses of our Georgian city squares, providing an A to Z for their care and repair.


Talks, which will commence on Tuesday 12th February 2013 (1pm to 2pm) and continue for 12 weeks, will take place in the Helen Roe Theatre, RSAI, 63 Merrion Square, Dublin 2.

It is possible to attend all, one, or as many of the talks as you wish. The talks are priced at €10 (€5 students), which you may pay for at the door or book in advance for a special reduced price of €100 (€50 students) for all 12 lectures. Complimentary to the Tuesday talks will be a Saturday morning walking tour, at additional cost of €10 (€5 students).
